## **California**

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### **CAL GRANT PROGRAM**

The Cal Grant Program is a state-funded educational opportunity grant program to assist students in paying for a college education. As a result of recent legislation (SB 1644), the existing Cal Grant Program has been changed and additional grants have been added.

#### **General Cal Grant Eligibility Requirements**

All Cal Grant applicants must:

- 1) Be California residents,
- 2) Be U.S. citizens or eligible non-citizens,
- 3) Meet U.S. Selective Service requirements,
- 4) Attend an eligible California qualifying postsecondary institution,
- 5) Be enrolled at least half-time,
- 6) Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress as defined at school of attendance,
- 7) Have family income and assets below the established ceilings,
- 8) NOT be in default on any student loan, and
- 9) NOT owe any federal or state grant refund.

Entitlement awards are guaranteed for all students who meet program eligibility requirements.

#### ***Cal Grant B Entitlement Awards***

These awards provide grant funds for access costs for low-income students in an amount not to exceed \$1,551. This grant is to be used for living expenses and expenses related to transportation, supplies and books. Beginning with the second year of Cal Grant B benefits, Cal Grant B also helps pay for tuition/fees for California residents attending qualifying institutions offering undergraduate academic programs of not less than one academic year. Awards are guaranteed to every graduating high school senior who has at least a 2.0 GPA and meets program eligibility criteria.

#### ***Cal Grant B Competitive Awards***

These awards provide grant funds for access costs for low-income students in an amount not to exceed \$1,551. This grant is to be used for living expenses and expenses related to transportation, supplies and books. Beginning with the second year of Cal Grant B benefits, Cal Grant B also helps pay for tuition/fees for California residents attending qualifying institutions offering undergraduate academic programs of not less than one academic year. Students must have at least a 2.0 GPA. Award selections are based on a composite score that takes into consideration your family's income, parent's educational level, GPA, time out of high school and other factors.

#### ***Cal Grant C Awards***

These awards help pay for tuition and training costs at occupational or career colleges. This \$576 award is for books, tools and equipment. You may also receive up to an additional \$2,592 for tuition at a school other than a California community college. To qualify, you must enroll in a vocational program that is at least four months long at a California community college, private college, or a vocational school. Funding is available for up to two years, depending on the length of your program.

### **CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION OF PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY SCHOOLS ("CAPPS")**

Two full (maximum tuition and fees for one program) scholarships, which include cost of books and supplies, will be awarded each year by an independent selection committee. The committee, appointed each year by CAPPS, will review applications and award scholarships on the basis of merit and career interest. Adults and graduating high school seniors are eligible to participate. ## **Colorado**

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### **COLORADO STATE GRANT**

The Colorado State Grant Program is designed to assist Colorado resident undergraduate students with demonstrated financial need, to attend eligible post-secondary colleges and universities in Colorado. (On-line courses are excluded.) Applicants must be first year, first time, full-time (12 credit hours) undergraduate students.

In order to receive a Colorado State Grant, a student must also meet satisfactory progress requirements and have financial need. For additional requirements and information, contact the Financial Aid Office on Campus.

## **Florida**

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### **FLORIDA BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

This program is available to those individuals qualifying for the Florida Academic Scholars, Florida Merit Scholars, or the Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars programs. Eligibility requirements are determined by the state. Students must attend the Campus on a full-time basis. Interested students should contact their high school counselor for more information.

### **FLORIDA STUDENT ASSISTANCE GRANT ("FSAG")**

The Florida Student Assistance Grant ("FSAG") is a grant program available to qualified students who meet the two-year residency requirement of the State of Florida. The financial assistance available is based on the financial need of the student. Students must be in an associate or bachelor level degree-seeking program to qualify and must be enrolled full time.

### **CAMPUS FLORIDA ASSOCIATION OF POSTSECONDARY SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES ("FAPSC") HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

## Tennessee

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### **COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Memphis Campus awards community scholarships to qualified adult minorities and women in the greater Memphis area. Interested applicants must solicit two letters of nomination from community leaders and submit these letters to the Campus Acceptance Interviewer. The community leaders may not be in any way related to the applicant and must state this fact in their nomination letter. The letters should address the character of the applicant and should detail the actions of the applicant that have had a positive influence on some aspect of the greater Memphis community.

Scholarship awards are for \$1000 and are paid out over three months. Students may receive only one Memphis Campus Community Scholarship while they are enrolled at the college. Students who have already entered their final quarter or have completed more than five modules in an eight module program are not eligible to apply for the Memphis Campus Community Scholarship.

## Texas

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### **CAREER COLLEGES AND SCHOOLS OF TEXAS ("CCST") SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

The Career Colleges and Schools of Texas ("CCST") has a program that offers four scholarships to each high school in the State of Texas. These scholarships are awarded to qualifying graduating seniors. Recipients accepted in degree or diploma programs are eligible to receive scholarship funding. Scholarship recipients are selected by the high school faculty and staff in the spring of each year. Interested students should contact their high school counselor for information and applications. Recipients of this scholarship must begin classes at a Campus located in Texas no later than the end of the calendar year in which they graduated from high school. Scholarships are not transferable, nor can they be exchanged for cash.
