

Institutional Aid Programs

Students are responsible for payment of all tuition charges, regardless of what type of funding they may obtain. Title IV funding that a student may be eligible for based on the determination of the Federal government, in a combination of loans and grant funds, may not be enough in itself to pay for all tuition charges in all cases. Therefore, students may pay for this difference in the following ways:

- 1) From their own funds
- 2) By borrowing the necessary funds from a bank or lender of their choice, or by
- 3) Applying for an institutional loan from Remington College.

Loans from private lenders are made solely on the criteria and requirements of those lenders, and Remington College has no decision making authority on which students may/may not qualify for a private loan for educational purposes.

Institutional Loans

Institutional loans from Remington College are made on a student by student basis. Monthly payment requirements for an institutional loan depend on a number of factors, including the program the student is enrolled into, anticipated or estimated Title IV aid, and academic year need. Remington College reserves the right to limit the amount of loan funds available to specific students for tuition related expenses. The Student Finance Department at the campus the student is enrolling into can provide additional information regarding institutional loans.

Academic Achievement Scholarship

The Academic Achievement Scholarship is available to students enrolling for the first time in one of the programs designated for participation in the Academic Achievement Scholarship program, and who satisfy the eligibility requirements set forth below and begin their course of study on or after December 3, 2012. The Academic Achievement Scholarship is not available to re-enrolling or re-entering students.

The amount of an Academic Achievement Scholarship is \$500 per academic year (typically 9 months). To be eligible to receive an Academic Achievement Scholarship, a student must have 1) graduated from high school in 2014 or later with a cumulative high school grade point average of 3.00 or higher based on a 4.00 scale and 2) submitted an Academic Achievement Scholarship Application.

Career Ready Scholarship

The Career Ready Scholarship is available to students enrolling in one of the programs designated for participation in the Career Ready Scholarship program, and who satisfy the eligibility requirements set forth below. The amount of a Career Ready Scholarship is \$1,500, which is awarded upon successful completion of the student's program and is applied towards the student's balance, if any, at the time of graduation. To be eligible to receive a Career Ready Scholarship, a student must 1) be a civil servant, a first responder, a law enforcement officer, active military, reservist, or government agency employee; 2) provide proof of employment from an approved agency at enrollment or at re-enrollment/re-entry and upon completion of the program; 3) enroll in and graduate from a Remington College program designated for participation in the Career Ready Scholarship program; and 4) have submitted a Career Ready Scholarship Application prior to enrollment. Economic Hardship Grant

The Economic Hardship Grant is available to new students enrolling on or after March 26, 2020 in one of the programs designated for participation in the Economic Hardship Grant for a class start occurring prior to August 2020. The Economic Hardship Grant is not available to re-enrolling or re-entering students. The amount of an Economic Hardship Grant is \$1,000, which will be applied to an eligible student's account as a tuition credit after the student has been activated. New Career Success Scholarship

The New Career Success Scholarship is available to students enrolling in Remington College for the first time that can satisfy the eligibility requirements set forth below and begin their course of study in one of the programs designated for participation in the New Career Success Scholarship program on or after December 3, 2012. The New Career Success Scholarship is not available to re-enrolling or re-entering students.

The New Career Success Scholarship provides either 1) \$1,500 per academic year (typically 9 months) to students enrolled in eligible degree programs or 2) \$1,000 per program to students enrolled in eligible diploma programs. To be eligible to receive a New Career Success Scholarship, a student must a) demonstrate Financial Need, as determined by the Student Finance Department at the Remington College Campus the student attends and b) submit a New Career Success Scholarship Application and satisfy the eligibility criteria set forth therein.

Financial Need means the Total Income reflected on the student's Institutional Student Information Report (ISIR) is less than or equal to the most recent National Median Household Income as published by the U.S. Census Bureau.
